Population and Segmentation Profile – Renfrew Youth Ages 12 to 25 Aug 2015

Objectives of Document:

- Develop a better understanding of the client population.
- Develop a better understanding of the variation and segmentation within this population
- Help support a population/client perspective for the project.

Highlights

- The rate for ED usage for Renfrew youth with a Mental Health/Substance Use Crisis is high when compared to other jurisdictions.
- The majority of Renfrew County youth seek emergency room services within Renfrew County
- Mental Health and Addiction (MH/A) based visits represent around 4% of all ED visits
- Approximately 15% of MH/A ED visits arrive by ambulance.
- The majority of MH/A ED Visits have a CTAS level of 3 (Urgent/Potentially Serious)
- Mood and Anxiety disorders are the main reasons a Renfrew County youth will present at an ED for a MH/A issue.
- The majority of youth are discharged home (77%) and 17% are admitted as inpatients within the facility. (A higher percentage when compared to Champlain where 15% are admitted as inpatients)

Data Source & Methodology:

The data presented in this report has been retrieved from Ontario Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care, IntelliHEALTH ONTARIO, unless otherwise noted.

Categorizing Mental Health: Tables/charts associated with MH/A visits utilized a common definition of mental health/substance use related ICD-10 codes as Main Diagnosis derived from <u>Care for Children</u> and Youth with Mental Disorders, CIHI. May 2015. See Appendix A for details.

Data Note: The numbers presented in this report are only identifying an ED visit where the **Main Diagnosis** is a MH/A diagnosis. If another issue at an ED visit takes precedence but there is an underlying MH/A issue, this is not captured in this report. Therefore, the counts presented in this report are likely an undercount of all ED visits where MH/A were an issue and/or secondary diagnosis.



Current Understanding of the Population:

There are over 17,000 youth (ages 12 to 25) residing in Renfrew County. Of these youth 4,388 are between the ages of 12 to 15, while the majority (12,881) are in the older age category of 16 to 25. The largest numbers of youth reside in the Pembroke and Petawawa areas.

Emergency Room Usage by Renfrew Youth

The majority of emergency room visits for youth (ages 12 to 25) residing in Renfrew County were to one of the five Renfrew County hospitals (94.5% of visits in 2013-14, 95.2% of visits in 2014-15), with over one third (36.6% in 2013-14, 36.0% in 2014-15) of visits being made to the Pembroke Regional Hospital.


Emergency Room Usage for MH/A issues:

Emergency Room Usage by Renfrew Youth is higher than what is seen in other settings. When compared to the rates per 100,000 published by CIHI for children and youth for Champlain and Canadian rural settings, the ED visit rate for Renfrew youth is much higher.

What Emergency Rooms Do Renfrew Youth Go to For a MH/A Crisis?

In 2013-14, 81.8% and in 2014-15, 82.4% of emergency visits for youth (ages 12 to 25) with mental health and/or addiction as a main problem diagnosis were to one of the five Renfrew County hospitals.

Over three quarters (76.4% in 2013-14, 77.6% in 2014-15) of emergency visits for youth (ages 12 to 25) with mental health and/or addiction as a main problem diagnosis were for a mood or anxiety disorder.



How did Youth Leave the ED? (Discharge Disposition)

The majority of youth are discharged home (77%), although you are more likely to be discharged home if you are in the younger age group (12-15). A larger percentage of older youth (16-25) are admitted as inpatients within the facility. The admittance rate is a higher percentage when compared to Champlain, where 15% of youth presenting at an ED are admitted as inpatients.

How many had their care transferred (either admitted to the hospital or transferred to another hospital? (For full age range 12-25)


