

A Regional System

Leading regional initiatives, Champlain Pathways to Better Care (Pathways) works with acute and community level mental health and addictions (MH&A) services to implement coordinated changes to the Champlain MH&A system, located in Eastern Ontario. In the Fall of 2018, Pathways drafted the first ever Champlain MH&A Health Human Resources Strategy (Strategy), which included a proposal for a regional approach to psychiatry recruitment.

In December 2018, the Strategy was presented to, and approved by the Champlain Hospitals Addictions and Mental Health Program Executive Steering Committee, composed of hospital CEOs. This set in motion, the first ever regional approach to psychiatry recruitment in the Champlain Region.

Our Health Region endeavours to support psychiatrists in a regional model that allows for unique, multi-setting practice opportunities across the Region. - Located in Eastern Ontario

- 43 Ministry funded community mental health and addictions agencies

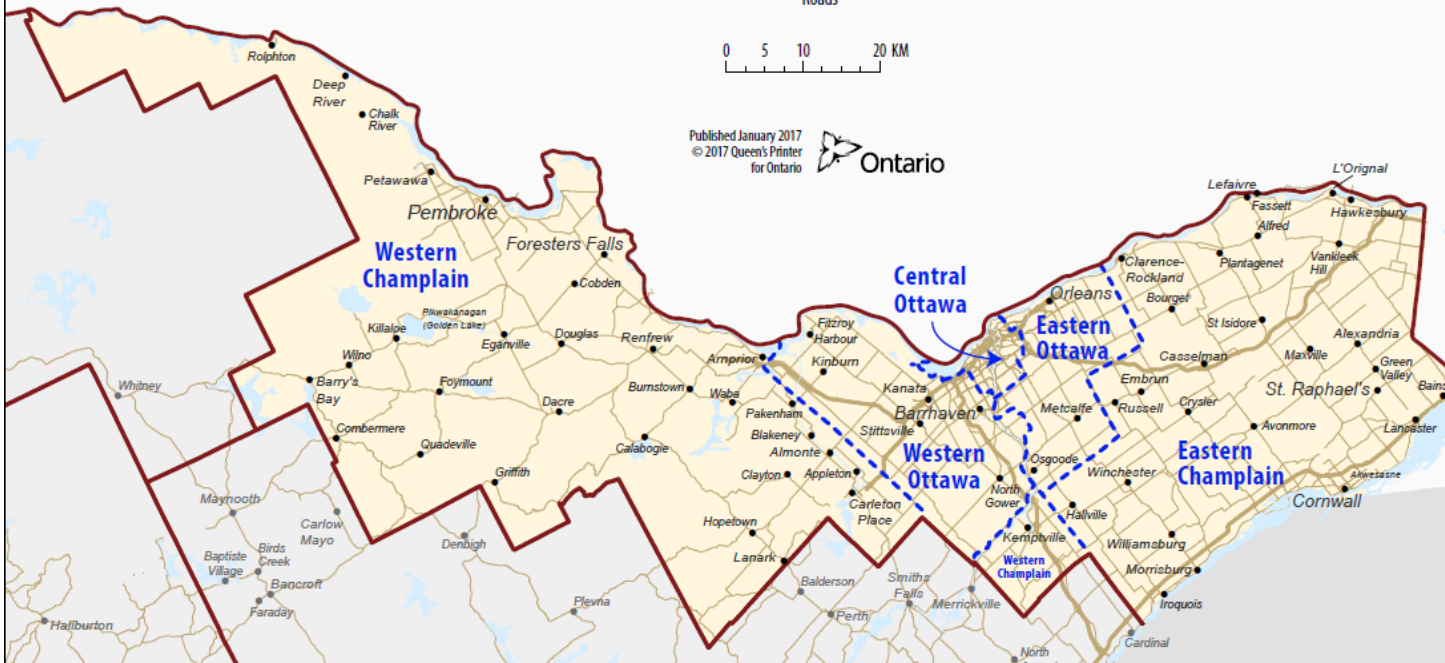
Champlain Local Health Integration Network (11)
